## **Scholarship Tips**

- Neatness counts, follow directions, and complete the application in full.
- Watch deadlines if your scholarship application requires counselor or teacher recommendation, you will need to allow time for that (1 week minimum).
- Proofread the entire application carefully looking for misspelled words or grammatical errors.
- It's not a bad idea to make copies before you send the application out, and make a note of the date you mailed the scholarship.

## **Procedure for Scholarships**

Every scholarship is different, so be sure to read the application carefully. Not all scholarship applications will require assistance from the Counseling Office. Many scholarships can be applied for online.

- If you need to include a transcript with your application, you can stop in the Counseling Office during your lunch hour or before/after school to obtain a copy from the Counseling Office Secretary. Be sure to read scholarship instructions to see if they require an official sealed transcript or if they require it mailed in separately from your application.
- If your scholarship application requires a Counselor Recommendation Form, please bring the completed scholarship application to the Counseling Office Secretary. **PLEASE** allow 4–5 business days for processing.
- Scholarship applications may be processed in the Counseling Office, however the student will be responsible for mailing the scholarship application out. The student can check back after 4-5 business days to pick up the completed scholarship application. (The exception would be if the scholarship instructions indicate a transcript to be mailed in directly from the high school, separate from the application.)
